





From building a simple Learning Center for 40 Nursery scholars in Ulingan, Tondo in 2010, the PEARLS Scholarship Program has now grown to a family of more than 500 scholars! We support these scholars by providing them with complete school supplies, vouchers for field trips and projects, opportunities for exposure trips and workshops, monthly grocery packs, and academic support through tutorial activities. The scholarship program aims to ease the economic burden of the families and to inspire the scholars to achieve their dreams. It also aims to hone their skills and values so that they can be role models and productive members of their own communities.

Number of scholars from 2016 to 2018:














### After School Program

### academic tutorial sessions

Every Sunday, our volunteers provide tutorial sessions for around 200 to 300 kids in Tondo, Manila. Our high school scholars in Bulacan also conduct tutorials for the younger scholars to help them in their academics.







### Art, Play, and **568** Reading Sessions

### art, play and reading sessions

On weekdays, we set up the Toy Library after the Feeding Program in our communities in Tondo, and in Bulacan. The toy library provides a safe space where kids can play while developing important social skills. We also have activities that help kids develop their reading and writing skills. Every Saturday we conduct art and crafts activities to develop their creativity and passion for the art.

LitClub LitWorld Be the Story.



In partnership with LitWorld, an international non-profit organization advocating for global literacy, we established LitClubs in different communities. LitWorld's "7 Strengths" (Belonging, Curiosity, Friendship, Kindness, Confidence, Courage, and Hope) are at the core of LitCub's programs. Through its various activities, LitClub aims to provide safe and supportive communities where children learn to value their own stories. Aside from this, it provides young people with engaging and productive literacy experiences during critical out-of-school time.

From March 13 to 16, our very own LitClub Regional Director Peachy Abellon, and LitClub Mentor Lilibeth Sucion, traveled to New York City, USA to share the result of their community action plan in Bulacan. The HOPE (Health, Opportunity, Power, and Education) Project was created during the HerStory Summit in 2017 together with LitClub mentors Catherine Orsal and Princess Soria. The aim of the program was to address the issue of teenage pregnancy in the community by providing access to reproductive health education, and opportunities to develop their skills and interests. The Summit was also an avenue for Peachy and Lilibeth to share inspiring stories of hope, love, and resilience that they have witnessed in the different LitClubs in the Philippines.

### **Feeding Program**

### 101,070+ total meals served

Every day, around 200 to 300 kids attend our feeding program in Helping Land, Tondo. Hearty meals are served to ensure that they do not go to school with empty stomachs. Our Nursery scholars in Bulacan are also provided with free breakfast. The kids also receive a daily dose of multivitamins after the feeding program.





### Health Center in Tondo, Manila

### 1,706+ patients served

We opened the Pearls Health Center with the goal of providing free check-ups and free medicines for the kids and families in Temporary Housing, Tondo. The clinic has a special focus on maternal and child health and in raising awareness about the "First 1,000 Days Program" of the government. This is done through the support of the Manila Health Department. The clinic is open from Monday to Saturday, from 8:00 am to 3:00 pm.

#### **Satellite Clinic:** Signing of Memorandum of Understanding

On April 3, 2018, Project Pearls signed a Memorandum of Understanding together with its partners - Samaritan's Purse Philippines, Unilab, Inc., Pamantasan ng Lungsod ng Maynila, City of Manila through the Manila Health Department, and Barangay 105, Tondo - to recognize the PEARLS Health Center as a satellite clinic of the Manila Health Dept. This partnership aims to increase the availability of maternal and newborn health services, and to decrease maternal and newborn morbidity and mortality rates due to low turnout rate of pre-natal, postpartum and newborn check-ups. 
