





# Number of scholars per community




### Number of scholars per school year




The main goal of Project PEARLS is to help children and families break the cycle of poverty through the transformative power of education. We recognize that the lack of economic resources is a barrier to one's access to education. To overcome this, the PEARLS Scholarship Program provides educational investments in the form of school supplies, transportation allowance, food packs, vouchers for field trips and projects, and other resources that are critical for academic success. We also build communities of support through mentorship and tutorial sessions. These learning opportunities aim to develop their aspirations, self-confidence, attitudes, skills, and knowledge so they can be empowered to shape a better life and future for themselves.

Currently, we have 553 scholars in four communities: Brgy. Batia, Bocaue, Bulacan; Helping Land, Tondo, Manila; Brgy. Malainen Bago, Naic, Cavite; and Kabasalan, Zamboanga Sibugay.



### Breakdown of sponsorship





The biggest concentration of our scholars is in the grade school levels. This school year, we also have the most number of scholars graduating from senior high school. For SY 2020-2021, we will have a total of 30 college scholars.

More than 50% of the scholars are under the sponsorship of different organizations and individuals. The remaining non-sponsored scholars are covered by our general fund acquired from grants and other donations.



# **Scholarship Program**




Over-all, there are 306 female scholars, and 247 male scholars.


#### Nursery Scholars' Development Report

This school year, we had 69 Nursery scholars who successfully completed the program in the PEARLS Learning Center in Bocaue, Bulacan. To measure their developmental milestones, we conducted a pretest and posttest in four key areas: language and literacy, numeracy, socio-emotional, and motor skills. The results of the test show the different characteristics of the child that correspond to a certain development level:

- 'Beginning' level: the child starts to show interests in the subject
- 'Developing' level: the child performs and participates on a regular basis with adult help
- 'Consistent' level: the child performs and participates independently on their own



The pretest and posttest show that there is a significant improvement among the children in the different learning areas. At the start of the school year, the highest percentage of kids in the 'consistent level' is only at 38% in the area of socio-emotional development. The lowest is in numeracy development where only 10% is in the 'consistent level'.



At the end of the academic year, more than 80% of the children are already in the 'consistent level' in the areas of language and literacy, numeracy, and motor skills. The highest is in the area of socio-emotional development where 94% are already in the 'consistent level'.

# **Community Learning Activities**



### **After School Program**

92 tutorial and mentorship sessions

The 'After School Program' (ASP) provides tutorial sessions for around 200 to 300 children and youth in Tondo every Sunday. ASP is a learning environment that allows students to understand the lessons on a more personal level through the help of volunteer teachers. In Bulacan, our high school scholars also conduct tutorial and mentorship sessions for the younger scholars to help them in their academics.

The 'Time-to-Learn' and 'Toy Library' are programs designed for children aged 4 to 6 years old who are not able to attend formal schooling yet. These programs provide them a safe space where they can develop social skills through meaningful play. They also learn basic reading and writing lessons. On Saturdays, we have brain booster activities that aim to develop creativity through art and crafts.

LitWorld is a US-based non-profit organization that works in different parts of the world with the core mission to "strengthen kids and communities through the power of stories." The various programs of LitWorld are centered on the "7 Strengths" (Belonging, Curiosity, Friendship, Kindness, Confidence, Courage, and Hope) that aim to empower children and youth through literacy. Project PEARLS is honored to be one of LitWorld's partner organizations since 2012. Under their guidance and support, we established LitClubs in different communities in the Philippines. LitClubs are designed to run outside of school time to bring children and teens together for "joyful learning, creative expression, community building, and developing social-emotional skills." We have trained LitClub mentors that oversee this in-depth literacy and empowerment program.

# Training for new LitCLub mentors and members

This year, we welcomed new LitCub members and mentors in Camarines Norte and in Cavite.

March 1 to 3: Aklatan sa Kostal, Camarines Norte

'Aklatan sa Kostal' in Camarines Norte is a humble initiative started by Arquiza family to serve as a library, computer learning center, and a safe space where children and teens can develop their different interests and talents. With the humble leadership of our newest mentor, Ms. Sol Arquiza, 23 boys and girls became part of LitClub-ASK. The picturesque and calming surroundings of Aklatan is a perfect place for these children to further enhance their storytelling and literacy skills.

#### October 8: Naic, Cavite

In mid-2019, the National Housing Authority started to relocate more than 700 families in Tondo to a new community in Naic, Cavite. Around 60 PEARLS scholars and families were among the first batch of relocated families. To assist them in the transition, we still continued with the Scholarship Program for the children and youth. We also saw the need to provide learning opportunities for the kids to help them cope in a new environment. Thus, LitClub-Naic was born. From being members of LitClub in Tondo they are now equipped to mentor the new batch in Naic.





The weekly LitClub sessions are designed to improve overall literacy levels and to encourage children to increase their social awareness and sense of personal value. Through its modules and unique learning activities, a strong support network and safe space is cultivated among the members and mentors.

In addition to these regular sessions, LitClub also conducts various activities throughout the year to promote the importance of literacy and to develop self-expression, confidence, and understanding.



### **World Read Aloud Day**

February 5 is World Read Aloud Day. This is an international campaign started by LitWorld in 2010 to celebrate the joy of reading aloud and to advocate for literacy as a fundamental human right.

In celebration of this important day, our LitClubs in Bulacan, Manila, and Zamboanga Sibugay conducted different storytelling and reading activities in their own communities. We also partnered with the National Library of the Philippines to encourage more students to participate and to advocate for global literacy.



# **LitClub Graduation in Zamboanga Sibugay**

A special graduation ceremony was conducted in Zamboanga Sibugay to celebrate the success of LitClub members who completed the Year 1 curriculum. This graduation signifies an important milestone in their "literacy journey" as they become more equipped and empowered in sharing the 7 Strengths in their communities!



### **International Day of the Girl**

The United Nations declared the 11th of October as the International Day of the Girl. As a worldwide observance day, it promotes girls' empowerment and the recognition of their human rights. It also mobilizes public concern and political will to address the unique challenges and needs faced by girls around the world.

LitClub members in Tondo, Bulacan, Zambales, and Zamboanga Sibugay conducted various activities to celebrate this day and to show solidarity in this important movement.

When Project PEARLS started its outreach program in Ulingan, Tondo in 2010, the first thing that was addressed was the basic need – food. It was based on the simple premise that hunger hinders children from learning. Until now, we still serve healthy meals and multivitamins to around 250 to 300 children in Helping Land, Tondo every day. This is to ensure that they do not go to school with empty stomachs. After the feeding, we conduct learning activities for the children: Time-to-Learn program, Toy Library, Brain Booster Program, and After School Program. We also provide free breakfast to our Nursery scholars in Bulacan.

We provide free check-ups and medicines for children and adults to treat common illnesses such as fever, diarrhea, cold, cough, and headaches. This is done through the help of volunteer doctors and nurses. As a recognized satellite clinic of the Manila Health Department, a special focus is given on maternal and child health and the promotion of the "First 1,000 Days Program".

Over the years, this community has become very close to our hearts. We established a LitClub for the children, and one of our partners helped build a classroom. This has been made possible through the leadership of their tribe chief, Kuya Carlito. He passed away a few weeks prior our visit. We dedicated this medical mission in his honor and memory.



# **Eye Exam and Dental Check-ups**Dr. Dan Baxter & Fresno Diwata Lions Club

May 19. Dr. Dan Baxter and his team from Fresno Diwata Lions Club served our dear Lola and Lolo (elderly) in Helping Land by giving them free eye check-ups and prescription glasses. They also brought volunteer doctors and nurses to give medical check-ups for adults and children.



# **Dental Mission in Tondo**Dr. Tess Venturina

*November 4.* Dr. Venturina led a dental hygiene lesson for children in Tondo. She also provided the following services for around 100 children: fluoride application, toothbrushing drill, and tooth extraction.





# Medical Mission in Tondo Dr. Fe Del Mundo Medical Center

November 25. Dr. Fe Del Mundo, one of the country's leading pediatricians and the first woman to be named National Scientist of the Philippines, established the first pediatric hospital in the country – the Children Medical Center, now Fe Del Mundo Medical Center (FDMMC). In commemoration of her death anniversary, the doctors and nurses of FDMMC served the children of Tondo through a medical mission.





### Family Planning Seminar and Services Likhaan Center for Women's Health

March 28. Likhaan Center for Women's Health has been our long-time partner in bringing reproductive health services to the communities we serve. They held a seminar on family planning (FP) and provided FP services for more than 40 women in Brgy. Batia, Bocaue, Bulacan. This program empowers women to have informed decisions relating to their own health, and to that of their families.

#### "You, Me, Empathy" (Developing Empathetic Leaders for Mental Health) by AISEC Philippines

February 17. Together with our volunteers and mentors, our high school and college scholars took part in this mental health forum organized by AIESEC Philippines. "You, Me, Empathy" tackled the importance of taking care of one's own mental health in order to become empathetic youth leaders and role models.

#### "FYI: For Youth Information"

April 26. 'FYI: For Youth Information' is a seminar for our high school scholars in Bulacan. We partnered with Likhaan to give valuable knowledge on teenage pregnancy, HIV awareness, and other concerns relating to reproductive health. We also invited Mr. and Mrs. Karlo and Chai Biglang-awa to share their journey on having healthy personal relationships.

#### Girls Advocacy Alliance (GAA): Youth Campaign and Advocacy Planning (Cebu City) by SPARK! Philippines

May 2 to 5. Through the invitation of SPARK! Philippines, our scholar and youth mentor, Aubrey Soria, participated in the GAA workshop held in Cebu City. In this workshop, youth leaders developed a campaign and advocacy plan to end gender-based violence and to empower girls and young women.

### Women of Ulingan, Tondo

Ulingan, Tondo is the first community adopted by Project PEARLS in 2010. Here, children and adults work hard every day to make charcoals or scavenge from garbage to make ends meet. This is where everything started for Project PEARLS. With a small group of volunteers back then, a weekly outreach program was established. It eventually led to the PEARLS Scholarship Program. In 2013, the National Housing Authority relocated the families to a new community in Brgy. Batia, Bocaue, Bulacan. Project PEARLS assisted them in the transition and continued the Scholarship Program for the children. But even with the new housing units, the families are still experiencing poverty because of the lack of income source and livelihood programs. To address these challenges, we created GROW - Giving Resources and Opportunities for Women.

GROW focuses on empowering women by providing them with the skills, resources, and training that they need to for their economic and social growth. The first batch of ten women were taught various skills that range from macramé to t-shirt printing and sewing. They also advocate for environment-friendly practices. All of the products that they produce are made out of upcycled materials such as scrap cloths and used tarpaulins.

# Pop-up BayaniHAN (Bayani for the Homeless, Abandoned, and Neglected)









The individuals and families living on the streets are among the most neglected and most vulnerable sectors of our society. Without the safety of homes, they are exposed to all kinds of risks such as diseases, malnutrition, abuse, and exploitation. In response to this, St. Arnold Janssen Kalinga Center provides services for the homeless of Manila. Since 2015, they have been providing services such as free meals and showers, counseling, and holistic support for education and livelihood.

In line with our mission to serve the poorest of the poor, we partnered with Kalinga Center to reach out to our homeless neighbors. We launched our new program, Pop-up BayaniHAN (Bayani for the Homeless, Abandoned, and Neglected) on November 30, in commemoration of the bravery of one of our greatest heroes, Andres Bonifacio.

We are grateful to our modern-day heroes - volunteers and partners - for the following services: restaurant-style feeding, haircut, medical and dental check-up, clothes "shopping", and grocery and care packages.


#### Melissa's Birthday Celebration with 55 Mothers





Total donations received in the US: USD 345,427.12




US and Int'l Donations

# Total Expenditures (PH and US)


